Served buffet style, the meal was highly approved by all. We had set up long tables the length of the ballroom and managed to squeeze all 42 people around them.

Sergei has a fantastic repertoire of music, from classical to standards, movie themes and jazz, as well as his own excellent compositions. Kate met him originally at one of the many art shows in which they both participate, and she booked him two years in advance for this once-in-a-lifetime event.

Guests could make themselves comfortable in the spacious living room, even nap in the life-size polar bear's lap.





The guests each received a souvenir of Kadon's print catalog, a custom flashlight pen, and a polished piece of jade, commemorating the 35th anniversary. Their name tags included little icons representing their special fields, interests, and connections to the Kadon *oeuvre*; that way those who did not know each other could have some fun deciphering the images and start a conversation.

Guests also received a paper puzzle to cut out and solve. The puzzle, titled *11 Magic Cubes*, showed 11 of the 35 hexominoes (shapes made of 6 squares joined) that can fold into a cube. But first the numbers 1 through 6 are entered into the squares of each shape to form equations. Then they are cut out, folded, taped, and become cubes with which to solve another group of 3D challenges.
